7-9 Sub School

Hello all, can you believe it is November already?

Term 4 allows for year 7-9 students to take advantage of the many opportunities and grow from the challenges that are presented to them. Assessment practices are an essential part of teaching and learning. Creekside's 3 Weekly reporting process provides the avenue for students, parents and teachers to reflect upon frequent feedback and set goals; engaging meaningfully and purposefully in the learning process. This allows the

students to value that knowing 'how' to learn is as important as knowing 'what' to learn. When students really know the how in relation to their learning, their capacity for improving is enhanced. We refer to it as metacognitive thinking or learning about learning.

Term 4 also provides the opportunity to celebrate learning achievements and growth that has occurred throughout the year. Learning is not linear and in fact sometimes it may be a step back before moving forward, but that growth occurs when we do our best to learn from the challenges faced. All Year 7's, 8's and 9's will be working on completing several common summative assessment tasks as the term progresses, and the students will also be preparing for their Maths, English, Science and Humanities examinations.

The Year 9's doing additional preparation for a Physical Education and Health exam. As preparation for this assessment period, teachers will be supporting students with their time management, revision and goal setting. It is important that the focus during this period is on the learning growth that it provides for the students.

Make sure you speak to your child's homegroup and/or subject teachers if you require any further advice about specific learning needs during this time. You should have received a bulletin via Compass that has timetables and expectations for exams. It is great to see how popular and frequented Thursday night homework club has become.

Right up until the end of the school year, Creekside students will continue to be provided with opportunities to put their learning into action both within and outside the classroom. Over the next two weeks, these will include: Regional sporting competitions for Years 7 and 8 students that have qualified in Tennis, Cricket and Volleyball. The Year 9 Outdoor Ed classes are going sailing. The Year 8 cohort will be learning about graffiti prevention and how to be good citizens.

As you would expect, we have started planning for the 2019 school year. One aspect of this planning is to allocate students into classes. In doing so, we consider two aspects in particular: balanced class groupings and where we will place our teachers.

I ask all parents to understand that it may not be possible to satisfy all requests without compromising children's learning. If you have specific information please provide it in writing by **Wednesday 7 November** and address it to me personally. **Only communication provided through this process will be considered.** Please understand that we will not consider requests for specific teachers.

Over the past few years, we have received a very small number of requests, which tells us that parents trust our judgment on what is best for their children. I am sure that this year will be the same.

French Corner

BERTHE MOUCHETTE

Berthe Mouchette was a unique woman with a discrete but audacious nature for her time, and an artist in love with the French language and culture. She was a French artist who arrived in Melbourne in 1882 with her

husband and her sister. Berthe was a successful portrait painter and professor of art, and with her sister she bought a school for young girls in St Kilda in 1886. It was there that the first meetings of the Alliance Française were held in 1890.

In Victoria, the Berthe Mouchette Competition plays a key role in the promotion of Francophone language and culture. Every year between May and November it is experienced by more than 16,000 candidates; by working alongside primary and secondary schools in Victoria which offer French, it aims to reward the best students of the subject. A French examiner comes to the school and candidates from years 3 to 10, aged from around 8 to 16, recite before them a poem proposed by the Alliance. Students must recite a poem or the discussion of a theme studied in class. At Creekside we had over 60 students who participated. Year 7 students - Julia D and Jeremy R went up to the finals and were awarded certificates.

CSEF – CAMPS, SPORTS, EXCURSION FUND

The Victorian Government has committed to providing eligible students with Camps, Sports & Excursion funds (CSEF).
