The Yr 8 students will be going through the elective process, making subject selections for 2018. This is a great opportunity for families to discuss the importance of education and the possibilities available to all students if they work hard and focus on doing their very best throughout their school years.

Finally, I wanted to share part of a conversation I had with a parent this week. The conversation started from an enquiry around an internet company offering a device that could restrict the hours wifi was available in the house as the student was staying up all hours of the night. My tip to the parent was to simply take the power cord or cable to bed when they went to bed and the parent restricted wifi at home.

## White Ribbon Day at Creekside College

On Friday 23 November students and staff took part in some activities for White Ribbon Day. Every class in Years 7 to 9 was shown a brief but moving presentation about why we support and promote this day at school and indeed around Australia.

The shocking statistics show that every week at least one woman is killed by a partner or former partner, and this has to stop. In 2018 so far we have lost 61 women. Eleven of them during just two weeks in October alone. That is way more than one woman a week.



White Ribbon Day's aim is to not only raise awareness but to motivate and encourage men who witness violence to stand up, speak out and take action against it in a safe way. Men doing this is incredibly powerful, and makes a difference. Taking a stand helps to remove the silence around disrespect and violence. Disrespectful attitudes towards women can turn into violence. We are all equal. We all deserve respect and safety.

All of our students have the right to be safe now and when they are adults. The riskiest age for women is 18 to 28 years old. Our community needs to be safe and free of the threat of gender based violence. This includes mothers, sisters, daughters, aunts, grandmothers, cousins, nieces, family friends and community members. We do it for the women who should not have been killed. They should still be here with their families.

There was also a fantastic combined Year 9 student and teacher netball game in support of White Ribbon Day! Absolutely superb participation, sportsmanship, and skills shown by all and a beautiful atmosphere to enjoy despite the wind and a bit of rain.

### CSEF – CAMPS, SPORTS, EXCURSION FUND

The Victorian Government has committed to providing eligible students with Camps, Sports & Excursion funds (CSEF). These funds are paid to the school to use towards excursions, incursions and camps for eligible students. To be eligible for the funding, a parent or legal guardian must be the holder of a current Healthcare card or Pension card. In order to receive the payment, a completed CSEF application form must be completed and submitted before the end of Term 2, 2019.
